- Vampirism is biological rather than metaphysical or mystical, thus creating a new category of humanoid species, interdependent, on a symbiotic existence. The human host is inexorably intertwined with a blood parasite that is derived from the blood of an ancient, nocturnal race of humanoid beings that pre-date human evolution called, Omjadda.
- Our Vampires were never *completely* dead as is the case in the majority of most vampire tales. The human suffers heart death only during the transference. Though, due to the ignorance of people and lack of a truly scientific measure, undertaking the process of the Ja Rủ Tộk (Jaa Roo TeOok), blood transference, allows one to presume that a death has occurred, hence the beginning of the rumor.
- Vampires are not immortal, as is the myth about them. Imbibing Omjadda blood allows human beings to live a life that is far longer than their normal course, averaging a few hundred years at best. Omjaddas themselves are not immortal either. Their metabolism and genetic makeup is vastly different than ours. They are an aboriginal species whose average lifespan ranges from 12 to 22 thousand years. To date, there is no actual measure of how long a symbiont (*aka*: Vampire) can live, due to the fact that it varies depending on the bond between parasite and host. Most symbionts eventually wind up going insane and destroying themselves.
- A symbiont can not fall asleep. They are perpetually awake, unless the parasite has entered its death cycle.
- Vampires are not effected by Crosses or Holy Water. (*Unless the water is boiling and the cross is heavy and blunt and someone has hit them over the head with it*) They do not shape change or control the elements of nature. They are just like us...only infected and transformed by a blood parasite.
- The Blood Parasite, called Jadaraa Soo (Jah Daa Ra Sue), is sentient and communicates to the host through a series of Blood Memories belonging to the Omjadda of its source, mostly comprised of carnal cravings – *Food & Sex*.
- The veiny system of the parasite is visible, just below the surface of the infected Host's skin. It can move interdependently of its own will. It craves blood to sustain itself. Over time the parasite reconstitutes the human cells to resemble an Omjadda. From its first inception into the host body the parasite is continually working to rebuild/reconnect to its former body...*its former self*.
- Fangs in this world are not teeth. They are the veiny parasite masquerading as fangs. Again, an imitation of the sentient creature to mimic its former self. When a vampire bites someone the veins that comprise the fangs unwind and snake through the body, absorbing blood.
- The parasite has the ability to absorb blood through the pores of the host's skin.
- Omjaddas have a very rich and long history derived from a matriarchal culture with a religion based around Layal, the moon goddess, and her brother Rah, the vengeful sun god. Forced to leave their homelands due to a climate change they migrated throughout the world and began to influence the social and religious development of human civilization. There is only a small contingent of them still around today, about 650 total from all seven clans. They are our hidden elite, the true masters of our society.
- An original language is being created for this world: *The Omjadda Language*.
- Each story interweaves factual history (*People, Places, Events*) with lyrical fiction, providing a logical account for the creation of gods, religion, commerce, worldviews, slavery, industry, and vampirism.
- Vampires, like regular people, are responsible for their actions. They are not possessed by some demon, which allows them to not be responsible for the damage that they cause. Our stories are guided by Karmic effect.
- Stavros has developed two unique ways to portray a vampire's thirst on film that has never been seen or applied before in any vampire movie or television show. Once filming of Firefly's Kiss and Love in Vein has commenced it will be captured to digital video and Patented.
